## Township Trustee Proposes Pedestrian Park for Granger

Ken Lindsay, Harris Township Trustee, seeks community input on plans for a new park in Granger. Lindsay has a conceptual design to improve a township-owned field between the fire station and Harris branch library. Elm Road Pedestrian Park would become a destination on the Granger Path offering courts, play equipment, shelters, a bike repair station and more. To date, a public meeting was held and more than 300 people signed a petition supporting the effort.

Since taking office in January, Lindsay implemented a website (HarrisTownship.in), improved service to township assistance recipients, cut spending by \$50,000, found and collected \$60,000 in non-tax revenue, improved Harris Township Park (on Brummitt Road), and commissioned restoration of the township's two cemeteries. Plans are underway to further improve fire safe-ty by updating fire department infrastructure. Elm Ped Park improvements are expected in 2016.
