Lindsay is a fiscal conservative, believes in a limited but effective role for government, and is a member of the Republican Party. To date, the accomplishments he values most are bringing fiscal discipline to the township, increasing non-tax revenues, and both envisioning and creating Harris Township Park at Elm Road, which is just south of the library.
He is a proponent of the biblically based, financial teachings of Dave Ramsey, attended their counselor training education, and offered personal financial counseling as a ministry.

## State Road 23 and Main St. intersection to be widened
